North Ed Extends Accelerated Program for Child Care Certification with NMC, MAEYC

TRAVERSE CITY, Mich. – In response to the region's early child care workforce needs, Northwest Education Services (North Ed) is again offering support to those interested in pursuing child care certifications through an accelerated three-week program.

North Ed has partnered with Northwestern Michigan College (NMC) and the Michigan Association for the Education of Young Children, with support from Caring for MI Future, to assist individuals interested in pursuing their Child Development Associate (CDA) Credential. Costs to attend the accelerated program may be mostly or fully covered through a T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood ® Michigan scholarship. In addition to obtaining a CDA credential through the program, participants earn credits through NMC that apply toward an Early Childhood Associate Degree.

The program runs July 17 to Aug. 8, with classes taking place from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday. The accelerated course was first offered in 2022, when 14 people received their CDA credential. In 2023, 16 people participated in the course, while 18 people took it in 2024.

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
