Initial Data Analysis: The data shows that we have a significant percentage of our population that is not “on track” for grade level achievement.

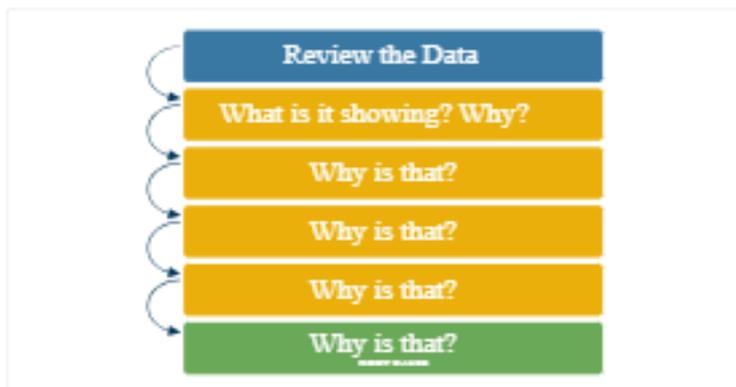
Initial Initiative Inventory and Analysis: We have a system in place for Tier 2 and Tier 3 during the school day. This process appears to be making positive change, but is not reaching enough students to make an impact district-wide. We are also limited by time due to the need for students to be in core classes.

Gap Analysis: FACS has a significant gap in desired outcomes for both literacy and math. Our desired state would be to close that gap by another 20%.

District Data Story Summary: We know that we are providing support to our student population in many ways utilizing MTSS. The room for growth that we currently have is to increase and expand our tutoring and summer school opportunities since taking away from class times is counterproductive to our cause. Our MTSS process, student support team, and professional development are all prioritized to look for ways to meet students’ academic needs. Time and staff during the school day are our primary barriers.

Summary: EdTrust defines expanded learning time (ELT) as programs or strategies implemented to increase the amount of instruction and learning students experience. ELT strategies include afterschool, summer, and in-school programs. The evidence suggests that extended learning time programs, including extended school day (ESD), extended school year (ESY), and expanded learning opportunities (ELO) programs that provide academic services during out-of-school time hours, can be effective in improving a range of educational outcomes for students. Findings also suggest that extended learning time programs may be more advantageous for low-income, low-performing, ethnic minority or otherwise disadvantaged students.
